At North Side Community School our students' learning is monitored using formal and informal assessments. Unit tests, teacher observations, running records and Teacher made weekly assessment are some of the tools we use. However, three times a year, our students are assessed using NWEA, a standardized assessment tool. A students is flagged as at-risk for academic failure when he/she scores basic or below-basic on NWEA. This upcoming year, we will also be using ANet interim assessments in grades 2 and up for ELA and math to determine level of understanding of material taught that trimester. We will track students understanding of each standard and come up with intervention plans for what they do not have mastered.
