Request for Proposals (RFP): Trauma-Informed Mental Health Services

Release Date: September 10, 2025 Proposal Due Date: October 3, 2025

Contract Period: Upon award - February 10, 2026

1. Introduction

North Side Community School (NSCS), a public charter school serving PreK-8th grade students in the City of St. Louis, seeks proposals from qualified and licensed mental health providers to deliver sustained, trauma-informed counseling and therapeutic services to students, and where necessary to support student recovery and restore the learning environment, to immediate family members and staff.

On May 16, 2025, a tornado devastated parts of North City, displacing families and inflicting widespread trauma on our school community. With support from a U.S. Department of Education Project SERV grant (\$100,000), NSCS will contract with local providers to expand mental health services beyond baseline capacity.

2. Scope of Services

Selected provider(s) will work in coordination with NSCS counselors, social workers, and administrators to deliver trauma-informed services, which may include:

- **Individual Counseling:** Ongoing one-on-one therapy for students experiencing trauma-related challenges (on-site and/or in office).
- **Group Therapy:** On-site small group sessions focused on trauma recovery, resilience, and coping skills.
- **Family Support:** Counseling or therapy for immediate family members, when necessary to support student recovery and reintegration (on-site and/or in office).
- **Family Education**: Evening workshops for adult family members focused on trauma recovery, resilience, and coping skills.
- Crisis Response: On-call support in the event of acute student or staff crises.
- **Targeted Trauma Interventions:** Short-term, evidence-based interventions (e.g., CBT, TF-CBT, EMDR) as clinically appropriate.
- Staff Support/Training (optional): Workshops or debriefings on trauma-informed practice and secondary trauma care.





3. Contract Period

- Services must begin promptly upon award, no later than November 2025.
- All funds must be fully expended, and services rendered by February 10, 2026.

4. Provider Qualifications

Proposals will be accepted from:

- Licensed mental health professionals (LCSW, LPC, Psychologist, etc.) or agencies employing such professionals.
 - o Demonstrated experience providing trauma-informed care to children and families.
 - o Capacity to provide culturally competent services to diverse urban populations.
 - Ability to coordinate with school-based personnel while maintaining confidentiality.

5. Proposal Requirements

Interested providers must submit a proposal that includes:

- 1. **Agency/Individual Information:** Name, address, contact person, qualifications, and licenses.
- 2. **Program Approach:** Description of therapeutic services, trauma-informed practices, and proposed delivery model.
- 3. Capacity: Anticipated caseload and availability for school-based or family sessions.
- 4. **Budget/Rate Structure:** Hourly or per-session rates for individual, group, and family therapy, plus any additional service costs.
- 5. **Experience & References:** Description of prior experience with trauma-informed care and at least two professional references.
- 6. **Compliance Statement:** Agreement to adhere to confidentiality laws (FERPA, HIPAA) and to provide required documentation for Project SERV reporting.

6. Evaluation Criteria

Proposals will be evaluated on:

- Qualifications & Experience (30%) Demonstrated expertise in trauma-informed mental health care.
- **Program Approach (30%)** Quality and clarity of service model, including cultural responsiveness.
- Capacity & Availability (20%) Ability to meet the timeline and service demand.





• **Cost Effectiveness (20%)** – Reasonableness of proposed budget within the \$100,000 grant allocation.
