# **Shared Partnership**

This plan was created with input from parents, teachers, and school leaders. It is reviewed and updated each year at our family meetings, where parents are invited to share ideas and vote to adopt changes. Each family receives a copy in our Parent & Student Handbook and can also access it on our website or by request in their preferred language.

## Parent Meetings and Communication

An Annual Title I Meeting is held at the beginning of each school year to explain how Title I supports our students and how parents can be involved. Families receive notices about meetings through Class Dojo, School Messenger, and posted flyers. We host flexible meeting times and will arrange home visits when needed to remove barriers to participation. We provide interpreters or translated materials when needed so all families can participate fully.

# **Supporting Student Achievement**

Together, we help children reach high standards by keeping students in school every day, on time, and ready to learn; reviewing homework and encouraging a positive attitude toward learning; maintaining two-way communication between home and school; and participating in parent-teacher conferences, open houses, and family events. Teachers and administrators commit to providing a caring, safe classroom and high-quality instruction, setting clear academic goals aligned to the Missouri Learning Standards, communicating regularly about progress and behavior, and offering support for families through workshops and take-home materials.

#### Parent Training and Resources

We provide information sessions to help parents understand Missouri Learning Standards, the MAP test, and classroom assessments. We hold workshops that show parents how to support reading, math, and homework at home. Materials from these trainings are available in print and online for all families.

#### Parent Feedback and Decision-Making

Parents are invited to help review and improve our programs at regular family meetings. Examples include helping shape uniform or homework policies, sharing input on Title I program goals, and voting on program updates during meetings. We respond promptly to all parent suggestions and make adjustments when possible.
